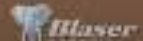

Pheasants refer to several genera within the subfamily Phasianinae, of the family Phasianidae in the order Galliformes. Pheasants are characterised by strong sexual dimorphism, males being highly ornate with bright colours and adornments such as wattles and long tails. Males are usually larger than females and have longer tails. Males play a part in rearing the young. Pheasants typically eat seeds and some insects. The best-known is the Common Pheasant. Various other Pheasant species are popular in aviaries, such as the Golden Pheasant (*Chrysolophus pictus*).

From the 1st October until the end of January, Pheasants are the mainstay of many estates because they offer a great sporting challenge to sportsmen around the country. About Partridges

Partridges are birds in the Pheasant family, Phasianidae. They are a non-migratory Old World group. These are medium-sized birds, intermediate between the larger Pheasants and the smaller quail. Partridges are native to Europe, Asia, Africa, and the Middle East. Partridges are ground-nesting seed-eaters. According to Greek legend, the first Partridge appeared when Daedalus threw his nephew, Perdix, off the sacred hill of Athena in a fit of jealous rage. Supposedly mindful of his fall, the bird does not build its nest in the trees, nor take lofty flights and avoids high places.

The shout of "Woodcock forrard" is enough on its own to excite many people. After a 'fall' of Woodcock, when they've arrived fresh from Scandinavia, they're most often seen flitting tantalisingly across snow laden forest rides. They are indeed a challenge with their silent jinking flight which makes them prized by many sportsmen, from all over the world. Loved and coveted as a surprise on a normal shooting day or specially sought out on a dedicated Woodcock day they are certainly 'special'.

About Woodcock

Woodcock have stocky bodies, cryptic brown and blackish plumage and long slender bills'. Their eyes are located on the sides of their heads, which gives them 360° vision. Unlike in most birds, the tip of the bill's upper mandible is flexible.

As their common name implies, the Woodcock are woodland birds. They feed at night or in the evenings, searching for invertebrates in soft ground with their long bills. This habit and their unobtrusive plumage makes it difficult to see them when they are resting in the day. Most have distinctive displays known as "roding", usually given at dawn or dusk.

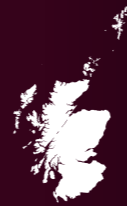

The Red Deer (*Cervus Elaphus*) is one of the largest Deer species. The Red Deer inhabits most of Europe, the Caucasus Mountains region, Asia Minor, Iran, parts of western Asia, and central Asia. It is the only species of Deer to inhabit Africa and can be found in the Atlas Mountains region between Morocco and Tunisia in north-western Africa. Red Deer have been introduced to other areas, including Australia, New Zealand and Argentina. In many parts of the world, the meat (venison) from Red Deer is used as a food source.

Trophy bucks are normally found in good quality arable land with a mixture of hard and soft wood forest with smaller headed bucks being in the hilly poorer quality land.

Either in the early morning with dawn breaking and the dew still on the grass - or in an evening outing where fading light is your greatest enemy, a Roe stalk is your opportunity to see the day from a new perspective, as you hunt this most elusive and beautiful of Deer.

the point where, with your heart pounding with excitement, it's time to take a steady aim and then inspect your prize.

The Roe Deer is a relatively small Deer, with a body length of 95-135 cm (3.1-4.4 ft), a shoulder height of 65-75 cm (2.1-2.5 ft), and a live weight of 15-35 kg (33-77 lb). It has rather short, erect antlers and a reddish body with a grey face. Its hide is golden red in summer, darkening to brown or even black in winter, with lighter undersides and a white rump patch; the tail is very short (2-3 cm or 0.8-1.2 in), and barely visible. Only the males have antlers.

Sika Deer originated from the Japanese Islands in North Eastern Asia and were introduced to Britain in the 19th century. Similar in appearance, although smaller than the Red Deer, the Sika Deer has very different habits and provides different challenges for the hunter: a secretive animal who will hide at the first opportunity, an exciting quarry in dense cover. The majority of the British population is in Scotland, particularly in the north and west but small pockets can be found throughout the UK. The population is however growing and expanding into new areas. The stags antlers are cast in March/April and by August most stags are in hard antler, i.e. antlers are clean of velvet.

Sika Deer Hind Stalking

Sika are better able than other Deer species to maintain body condition throughout the winter, especially in habitats that are in poor condition or less fertile. This may help to explain why Sika hinds tend to be more productive than other species of Deer in woodland habitats. Generally Sika are crepuscular in their movement patterns, visiting feeding areas at dawn and dusk. Sika commonly graze nocturnally under the cover of darkness. The opportunity for encountering Sika significantly increases at first and last light when they are moving to and from feeding areas. Seasonally, Sika move less than Red Deer, and do not congregate on wintering grounds in the same way as Reds.

Fallow Deer, in their dappled summer outfits or dowdy winter coats, are only found in a few areas of Scotland. Fortunately for our clients, we have access to estates where premier herds roam.

Whether it's in a slow woodland stalk or a trek on the open hill, the sight of their palmated antlers will lift your spirits as you bring your stalk to a successful conclusion.

The species has great variations in the colour of their coats, with four main variants, "common", "menil", melanistic and leucistic - a genuine colour variety...

Fallow Deer Doe Stalking

The male Fallow Deer is known as a buck, the female is a doe, and the young a fawn. Adult bucks are 140-160 cm (55-63 in) long with a 85-95 cm (33-37 in) shoulder height, and typically 60-100 kg (130-220 lb) in weight; does are 130-150 cm (51-59 in) long with a 75-85 cm (30-33 in) shoulder height, and 30-50 kg (66-110 lb) in weight. The largest bucks may measure 190 cm (75 in) long and weigh 150 kg (330 lb). Fawns are born in spring at about 30 cm (12 in) and weigh around 4.5 kg (9.9 lb). The life span is around 12-16 years.

The Chinese Water Deer originates from China and Korea, and is associated with lush riparian or swampy habitats. Smaller than Roe Deer, the males have elongated upper canines and no antlers. Chinese Water Deer were introduced to Woburn Park, Bedfordshire, in 1896 and Whipsnade Park in 1929-1930. Deliberate releases and escapes have resulted in the species becoming established in the wild since 1945, originally around Woburn then gradually expanding its range. The Chinese Water Deer (both sexes) may be shot from 1 November to 31 March.

** There is no statutory close season for this species. It is recommended that when culling female Muntjac, immature or heavily pregnant does are selected to avoid leaving dependent young.

Muntjac, also known as barking Deer and Mastreani Deer, are small Deer of the genus Muntiacus. Muntjac are the oldest known Deer, thought to have begun appearing 15–35 million years ago. Antlers are usually unbranched but a very short brow tine is occasionally found in old bucks. They also have visible upper canines (tusks) suggesting that they are a primitive species. Muntjac have two pairs of large glands on the face. Muntjac were brought from China to Woburn Park in Bedfordshire in the early 20th century. They are now widespread and increasing in number and range.

Hunting in Norway

We are pleased to be able to offer Moose and trophy Reindeer hunting in the North Eastern part of Norway. Hunting traditions are strong and have been for many generations. Today we hunt Moose & Reindeer here, but it is also possible to hunt Capercaillie, Red & Roe Deer, Bear, Wolf, Wolverine and Lynx during some parts of the season.

Moose Hunting

The Moose hunting season starts 25th September and ends 23rd December. The best season for hunting Moose is September and October. This is when the terrain is still dry and the weather is not so cold. November and December can also be good hunting months, though the snow and cold conditions can make the hunt more difficult. But if you are up for a new experience hunting on snow can be really exciting. The annual quota of 25-30 Moose annually is set during the spring. Different techniques of hunting are used depending on the terrain of the hunting area. In the open and

less forested upper area we can use spotters to locate game and then sneak into position. The upper area is also suitable for hunting with a leashed dog, where the dog silently tracks down the game and creates shooting opportunities. The lower area is more densely forested and we prefer to use unleashed dogs to search for animals and, unlike the leashed dogs, bark at the game to try to pin it down and signal to the hunters. This form of hunting will get you close to the game and you will really feel up close and personal to the action.

Best way of travel is by airplane to Oslo Airport – Gardermoen. From the airport it is about a 2 hour drive for Moose and 4.5 hours drive for Reindeer. You can bring your own rifles and by Norwegian law minimum calibre is 6,5×55, although for Reindeer we recommend larger calibres as .270, 308, 30-06 300mag. For Moose we recommend .308,30-06,9.3 x 62 or .375H&H mag'

Reindeer Hunting

Hendry, Ramsay & Waters is pleased to offer the following program in both the Breheimen and Jotunheimen national parks which holds Europe's last surviving population of wild Reindeer which have been hunted here since the Ice Age. The Jotunheimen National Park reopens this year after being closed to all hunting for the past 8 years so this untouched territory will really be worth a visit.

Only a few licences are available for big males, so this hunt is very exclusive and the season very short.

The landscape is breathtaking moorland framed with mountainous peaks reaching 2,500 metres above sea level.

At the Breheimen national, there are two hunting areas:

The South East park is our hardest hunting ground and it helps to be in good physical shape as you be hunting in a vast wilderness from our base camp in the mountains, and must be prepared to walk 5 - 15 kms per day, starting with a 2 hour trek (good path) to the comfortable log cabin which will be your base for the duration of the hunt.

The South West hunting area is reached by a boat and is the easier of all hunting areas which includes a cabin in the middle of the Reindeer area which is only about 1 hour easy walking from when you get off the boat. The scenery is simply stunning and really adds to the ambiance of the trip.

Hunting

Moose hunting season starts 25th September and ends 23rd December. The best season for hunting Moose is September and October. This is when the terrain is still dry and the weather is not so cold. November and December can also be good hunting months, though the snow and cold conditions can make the hunt more difficult. But if you are up for a new experience hunting on snow can be really exciting. The annual quota of 25-30 Moose annually is set during the spring.

Different techniques of hunting are used depending on the terrain of the hunting area. In the open and less forested upper area we can use spotters

to locate game and then sneak into position. The upper area is also suitable for hunting with a leashed dog, where the dog silently tracks down the game and creates shooting opportunities.

The lower area is more densely forested and we prefer to use unleashed dogs to search for animals and, unlike the leashed dogs, bark at the game to try to pin it down and signal to the hunters. This form of hunting will get you close to the game and you will really feel up close and personal to the action.

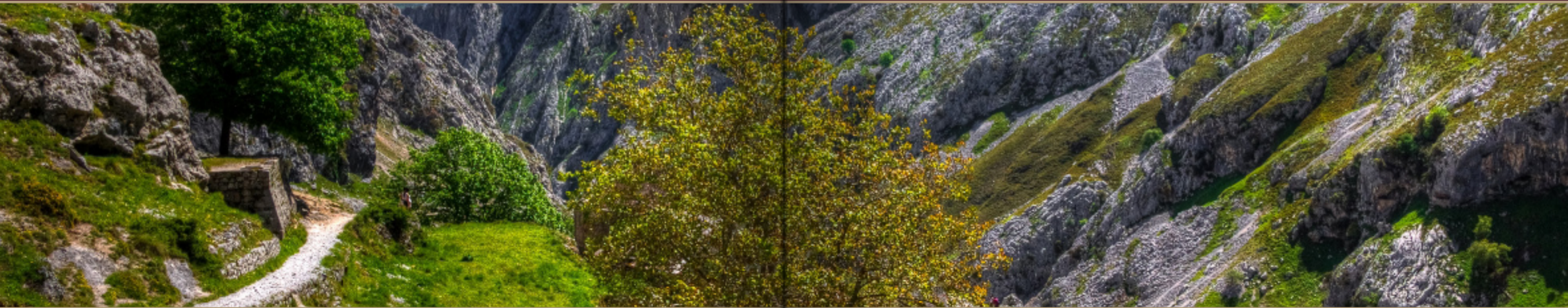

As with all goats, males have beards, while females do not.

Wild Boar are native across much of Northern and Central Europe, the Mediterranean region (including North Africa's Atlas Mountains) and much of Asia, including Japan and as far south as Indonesia. Populations have also been artificially introduced in some parts of the world, most notably the Americas and Australasia, where they are regarded as both an important food resource and an environmental threat. Elsewhere, such as England, populations have also become established after the escape of Wild Boar from captivity.
